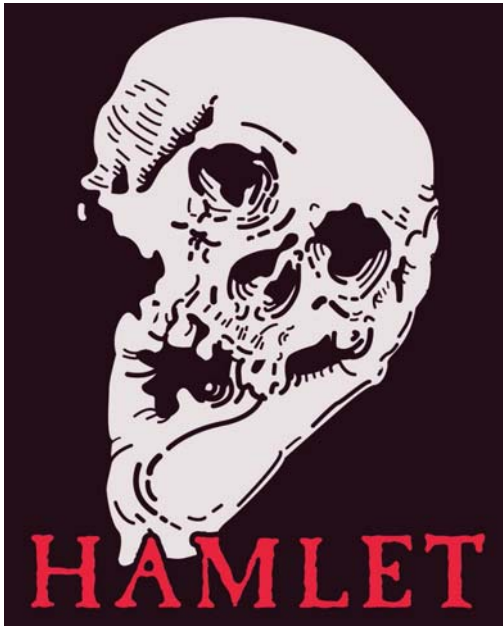

Tartuffe

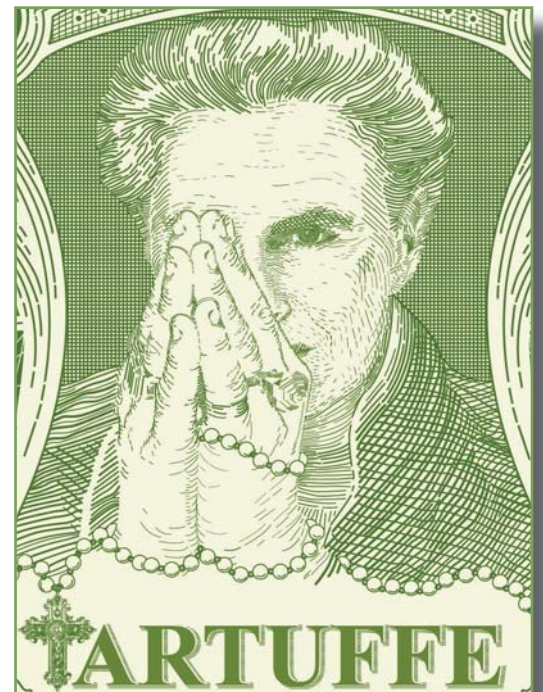
